Household Support Fund (HSF)

Grants Awarded October 2021 to March 2024

Funding from Central Government was made available to County Councils and Unitary Authorities in England to support those most in need to help with significantly rising living costs. Local Authorities had discretion on exactly how this funding was used within the scope set out in the guidance provided. Details within the guidance was amended by Government for each phase but the general expectation throughout has been it should primarily be used to support households in the most need with food and energy bills, and other related household essentials, covering a range of low income households.

Household Support Fund PHASE 1

1st October 2021 to 31st March 2022 (6 months)

- Total allocation to Redditch Borough Council: £260,345
- Total paid out to local voluntary and community sector organisations: £88,000 Breakdown provided below:

- RBC also allocated £91,490 for food vouchers for local schools and college and Holiday Hunger Scheme for children, young people and families.
- RBC used £13,692 (approx. 5% of the allocation) towards delivery/admin costs
